SOCIAL & POLITICAL ANALYSIS - PROCESS

Proactive steps to help influence a successful outcome, as well as reactive tactics for issue escalation and crisis management.



PART 1 – DOES YOUR PROJECT QUALIFY?

- Controversial
- Work where you do not have jurisdiction, customers, or previous experience.
- Areas with unique populations, that are considered typically disenfranchised (tribal, immigrants, minority)
- Require legislative action, bond approval, or major funding campaigns
- Is your organization suffering from reputation issues/concerns?



PART 2 - GATHERING INSIGHT

- Social, political and regulatory climate
- Historical and cultural overview
- Past major development projects
- Key influencers and decision makers
- Socioeconomics



PART 3 – EARLY/ONGOING COMMUNICATIONS

- Early planning
- Accurate & accessible information
- Engage & inform stakeholders
- Identify champions

...Follow through with sincerity



CRISIS MANAGEMENT

- Develop a plan (ahead of time)
 - What resources are needed/available?
 - Anticipate possible scenarios
 - Media relations and training
- Mobilization
- Deploy response
 - Deliver high-volume communications through multiple channels
 - Maintain connectivity & transparency
 - Show empathy for those involved
